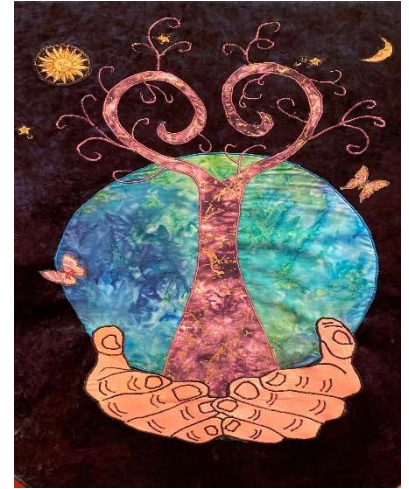

Dear Saint Luke's Members and Friends,

Life is full of beginnings and endings – not only in our personal lives and relationships but in nature itself. We anticipate the transformation of the green leaves and colourful blossoms of summer into the changing colours of autumn. We also look to the beginning of the liturgical season of **Creation Time**, which runs from **September 8 - October 13**. This year's theme is *"To hope and act with Creation."*

As the quote above from the UCC *Song of Faith* reminds us, being part of God's creation alongside mountains, plains, oceans, streams, plants and animals establishes a deep connection throughout this earth... not always acknowledged, but we believe that connection is present nonetheless. At times, hope may be challenged when stories of rising temperatures, fires, landslides and floods seem to overtake the news. Our hope may wane when humans forget the relationships we share with all facets of God's wondrous world. Yet, as expressed in the UCC *Song of Faith*, as well as this year's theme, we are still encouraged to take an active part with Creation (not against it) in the ongoing work of "healing and mending creation," all "in grateful response to God's abundant love."

Further along in the *Song of Faith*, it also says "we are called to be a blessing to the earth." I believe it is God's love within us that enables us to be that blessing, reciprocating the abundance of God's blessings given to us. I also believe it is the God's love surrounding us

that helps us appreciate more fully creation's beauty – within us and beyond. And I believe it is that love still shared in this world, evidenced by the many people still willing to share the responsibility of caring for our global community, that keeps hope alive. Let us perpetrate that hope.

We are thankful, as always, for the beautiful banners (pictured above) created by Saint Luke's own fabric artist Suzie Hollihan, and not just because we are approaching Thanksgiving in October. During the Season of Creation, these banners (antependia) grace our pulpit and lectern. Suzie's wonderful depiction of earth, held in the hands of the Creator, helps us visualize that very care expressed by faith leaders and environmentalists that is needed for the continued existence of our earthly home.

I invite you to play a positive part (individually and collectively, as we are able) in answering the call "*To hope and act with Creation.*" I also invite you to join us for worship on Sunday mornings, and for other activities outlined in our listings that follow, as we pursue God's work to be a blessing - in our congregation and our community.

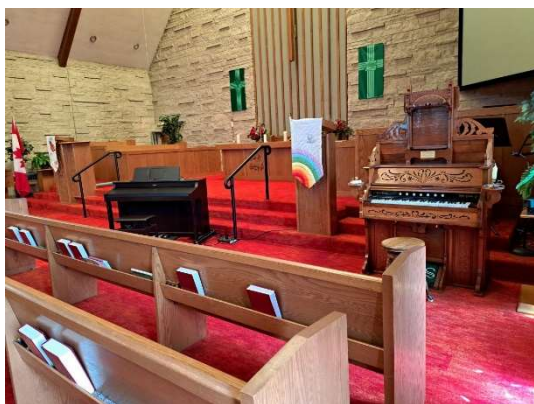
## **STEWARDSHIP - RETAIL CARDS**

### **Fireside Chat Group**

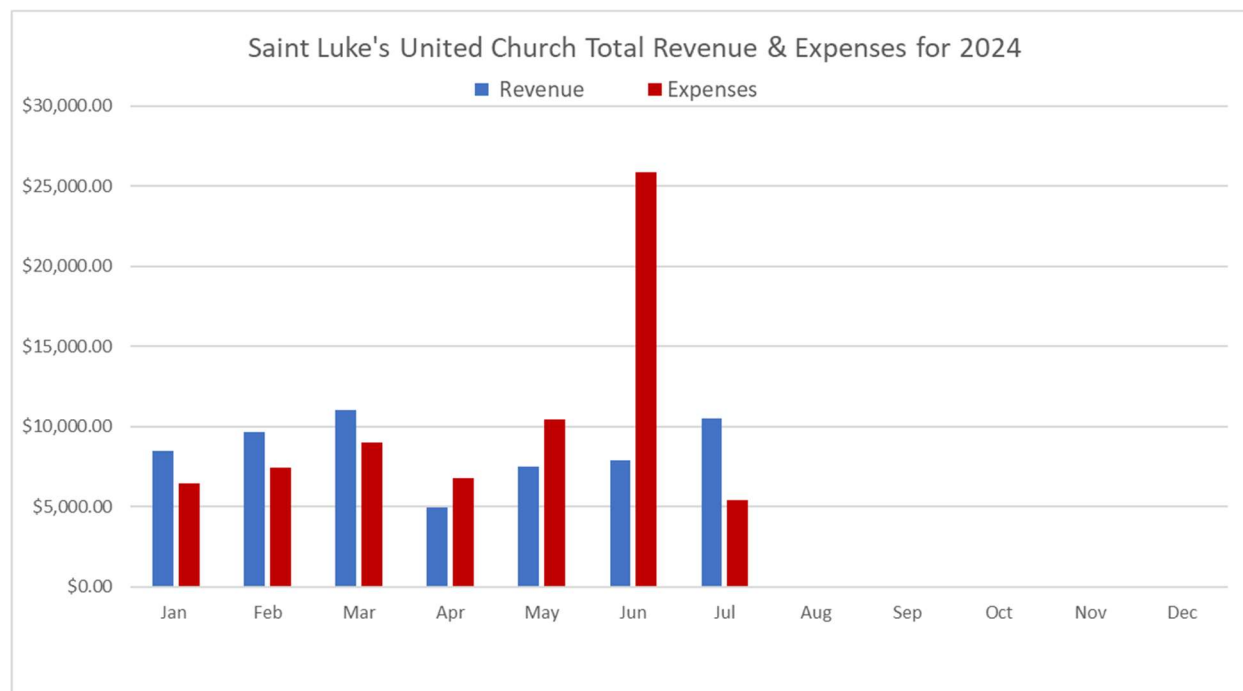
